
Marriage Enrichment Retreat Time with the Ones We Love the Most



GOD STORY by Linda Fosnaugh

For several years I have been a communion assistant at the 11:00 service. When I first volunteered to do this I was terrified that I would make a mistake or say the wrong thing. I could see myself dropping the bread plate or worse, the wine tray. At first I just wanted to get through it. I concentrated on getting it right. Then I realized that I was doing a great disservice to God, to the communicants, & to myself. Communion has always been very meaningful & emotional for me. Many times I can feel the tears running down my cheeks as I take the bread & wine & yet, as a communion assistant, I was so consumed with getting it right that I failed to be "in the moment." I failed to fully partake of the meaning of this sacrament & I failed to connect with those standing before me to receive the bread & wine.

So I stopped making it about me. Now when each person comes to my communion station, as I pass the bread or wine, I truly try to "commune" with them. I want them to know that we are all in this faith together, sharing the good & bad, the ups



Barry's Babblings -- by Barry Halter, Epiphany's Intern When the Frost is On the Punkin

I thought I would share something a little different this month! The fall is one of my favorite times of the year. I grew up playing football in Northern Indiana. The season always began in the "dog days" of summer. It never failed that the first day of camp would be the hottest day of August. But, as the season wore on, the days would get shorter and the trees would begin to change. I'll never forget the smell of burning leaves and the smoke that covered the football field during a late October game my senior year. A quarter-century later the smell of burning leaves takes me right back to that chilly fall evening.

For me, the fall season is a reminder that God provides for us. At this time the farmers are gathering in the corn and beans that have been growing all season. It is also a reminder that God has not given up on us. Even as the prospect of cold dark winter nights lie ahead, we know that new life will blossom in the spring.

Two Octobers ago, Pastor Jim Wilson shared a tradition and a poem with our Ministry of Preaching class. Every fall on the morning of the first frost, Pastor Jim recites the poem, *When the Frost is On the Punkin*, by James Whitcomb Riley. So, on that first chilly October morning, Pastor Jim recited the



poem for us. I can still hear the tone and timbre of his voice as I read the poem today. As I write this we have not had the first frost yet. I have a feeling that we will before you read it! When the Frost is On the Punkin by James Whitcomb Riley

When the frost is on the punkin and the fodder's in the shock, And you hear the kyouck and the gobble of the struttin' turkey-cock, And the clackin'; of the guineys and the cluckin' of the hens And the rooster's hallylooyer as he tiptoes on the fence; O it's then the times a feller is a-feelin' at his best, With the risin' sun to greet him from a night of peaceful rest, As he leaves the house, bareheaded, and goes out to feed the stock, When the frost is on the punkin and the fodder's in the shock

They's somethin kindo' harty-like about the atmusfere When the heat of summer's over and the coolin' fall is here - Of course we miss the flowers, and the blossums on the trees And the mumble of the hummin'-birds and buzzin' of the bees; But the air's so appetizin'; and the landscape through the haze Of a crisp and sunny monring of the airly autumn days Is a pictur' that no painter has the colorin' to mock - When the frost is on the punkin and fodder's in the shock.

The husky, rusty russel of the tossels of the corn, And the raspin' of the tangled leaves, as golden as the morn; The stubble in the furries - kindo' lonesome-like, but still A preachin' sermons to us of the barns they growed to fill; The strawstack in the medder, and the reaper in the shed; The hosses in theyr stalls below - the clover overhead! - O, it sets my hart a-clickin' like the tickin' of a clock, When the frost is on the punkin and the fodder's in the shock!

Then your apples all is gethered, and the ones a feller keeps Is poured around the celler-floor in red and yeller heaps; And your cider-makin's over, and your wimmern-folks is through With their mince and apple-butter, and theyr souse and sausage, too! I don't know how to tell it - but if sich a thing could be As the Angels wantin' boardin', and they'd call around on me - I'd want to 'commodate 'em - all the whole-indurin' flock - When the frost is on the punkin and the fodder's in the shock!
